Zoe says: "This has been a dream of my dad's for many years and I've grown up knowing I'd like to join him. We will start our climb on a 'warm up' mountain, Mount Meru, which will take us four days. After a couple of days rest we will then start on Mount Kilimanjaro. This climb will take seven days, reaching a height of 19,334 feet. We will be back home again by the 22 February.
