LEVEL 3 Land and Wildlife (Game)



This course is ideal for anyone with an interest in environmental conservation and management of landscape for game and wildlife.

You will study modern gamekeeping (lowland and upland) alongside wildlife and countryside management to achieve an industry recognised qualification based on practical skills and theoretical knowledge.

Four GCSEs at grade 4 (C) or above, to include two from English, Maths or Science with at least a grade 3 (D) in the remaining subject.
